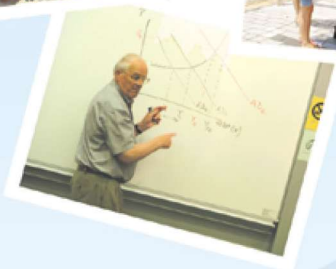




# The Chinese University of Hong Kong

### Distinctive Features

#### • *International Learning Environment*

The CUHK International Summer School (ISS) is open to local and international students; while attending, students live and learn alongside other academic achievers from a range of cultures. International students can immerse themselves in a multicultural environment and gain insights into Asian cultures, experience a unique learning environment on the green, spacious campus of CUHK outside regular term time, and enjoy the many pleasures of summer in Hong Kong – Asia's world city. CUHK and local students can have a taste of cultural exchange with international students without going abroad.

In 2012, around 650 students attended the ISS; 75% of them came from 36 places around the world. They made the programme truly international.

#### • *Outstanding Academics*

At the ISS, courses are taught by outstanding academics from CUHK and prestigious overseas universities. All of these academics are excellent teachers and many of them are frontrunners in research.

## Cultural Programmes

Social cultural activities will be organized to help international students discover Chinese and Hong Kong culture. These may include an orientation session to help them navigate around Hong Kong, as well as visits to cultural, tourist and historical sites, such as the Big Buddha and Victoria Peak.

## China Tour (Optional)

An optional four-day tour to Beijing, China will be held after the programme, leaving on 7 August and returning on 10 August. Participants will visit the major local attractions in Beijing, such as the Forbidden City, the Great Wall, and Tiananmen Square.

## Housing and Meals

Students who choose to reside on-campus will be housed in a student dormitory in double- or triple-occupancy rooms with shared bathroom facilities. Basic cooking facilities and communal facilities are also available.

For regular meals, students can choose to dine at one of the many student canteens located throughout the campus. It costs around HK\$25 to HK\$50 per meal.

- Exchange students are to be nominated by CUHK's exchange partners.
- The administrative fee covers orientation and cultural programmes, welcome and farewell dinners, and a student visa to Hong Kong.
- The hostel fee covers air-conditioning and simple bedding but does not include a meal plan.
