The International Conference Halls at the Clock Tower Centennial Hall have become available for students to self-study in.

It goes without saying that our first priority is to protect the health of all the students, as the risk of infection with the novel coronavirus still remains. On the other hand, we have started part of the classes that require in-person instruction such as laboratory experiments. In order to secure a place for students who come to the campus for these classes to study in between their classes, a temporary study room has been set up.

Please be aware that this measure is not to encourage students to come to the campus, but to enable students who need to attend classes to make the best use of their time between their classes with utmost precaution against COVID-19.

Time: 9:00 – 17:00 weekdays
Closed on Saturdays, Sundays, national holidays and the university holidays
Eligible Users: Undergraduate students, graduate students and other students of Kyoto University
Capacity: Up to 100 people

- Please make sure that you wear a face mask to prevent the spread of COVID-19.
- The room might be closed depending on the situations of the infection.
