— An Undergraduate Summer Research Program in Science and Biotechnology —

Undergraduate participants benefit from undertaking a research project under top faculty, being part of a cohort-based experience of seminars and networking events, and taking part in Japan Symposium where they meet their peers, learn about biotechnology, and hear from leading scientists.

Scholarship is provided, **travel** cost and **accommodation** are covered by the program.

/Eligibility/

Applicants must be undergraduate students who are:

- Enrolled in colleges or universities worldwide that award a bachelor's degree (or its equivalent); and
- At the minimum, have completed their first year of undergraduate study at the time the summer program begins, and
- Are not graduating before the summer program begins, and after the summer program ends will resume undergraduate studies for at least 1 semester or 1 quarter

Applicants must also have:

- A strong record of academic performance; and,
- A good working knowledge of English, demonstrated by a minimum TOEFL (iBT) score of 72, IELTS overall band score of 5.5, Cambridge English FCE, TOEIC score of 1095, TOEIC L&R score of 785, or TOEIC S&W score of 310, if not a native English speaker or English is not your first language, and
- An interest in pursuing a Ph.D.

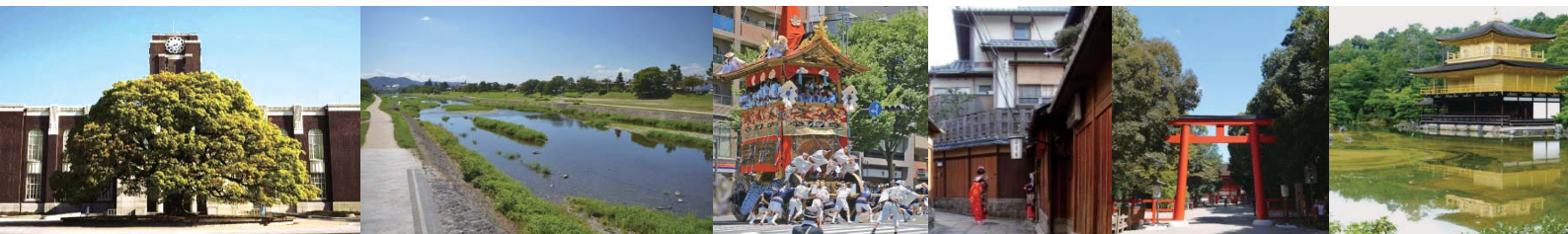
