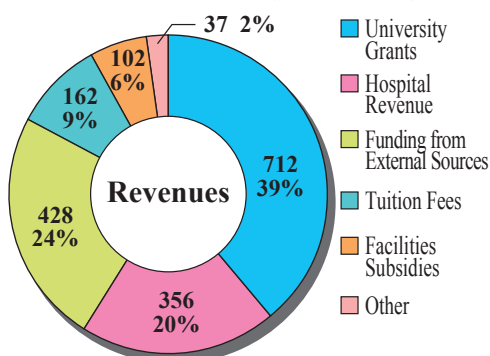

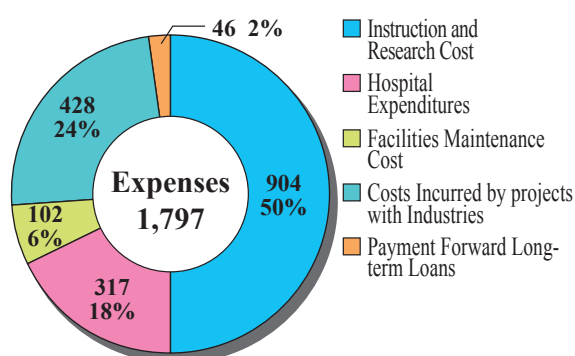
Revenues in Fiscal Year 2010
