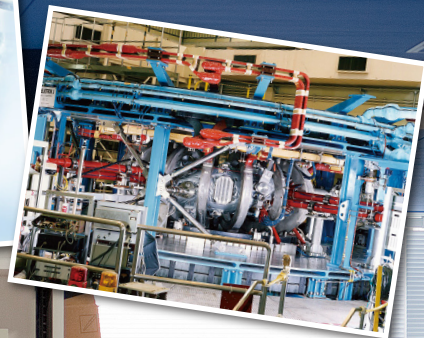

Founded in June 1897, Kyoto University has a long history and enduring traditions. The main campus is located in the historic city of Kyoto, a center of traditional Japanese culture. Since its founding, the University has been dedicated to furthering higher education and fostering an atmosphere of academic freedom. Graduates of the University play important roles in both inside and outside of Japan, as key players in politics, industry, and society.



## Cutting-Edge Research Hub

## LOCATION



Kyoto City, which has 1,200 years of history, has long been the nation's center of art, culture, and scholarship. Many of the city's historic locations, including several of its approximately 2,000 shrines and temples, have been classified as UNESCO World Heritage Sites. In Kyoto, ancient culture and tradition coexist side by side with technological innovation and entrepreneurship. The city is home to several major technology companies, many of which have cooperative links with Kyoto University.

Through studying in Kyoto and becoming familiar with the city and its culture, students will gain a deep understanding of Japan as a whole, and will also gain new insights into their own cultural identity. Experience of life in Kyoto is a valuable cultural experience for those seeking to broaden their horizons and be active in international society.

### Japanese Language

There is no specialized faculty or program for students who only want to study Japanese language at Kyoto University. However, the Education Center for Japanese Language and Culture of the Institute for Liberal Arts and Sciences (ILAS) of Kyoto University offers Japanese language courses to KU students.

## Kyoto University Degree System

**Note:** Some faculties have different systems. Please refer to the websites of individual faculties and graduate schools for further details.



### Undergraduate Faculties

Kyoto University offers bachelor programs in a wide range of study areas among 10 undergraduate faculties. The academic year begins in April. Students must have sufficient proficiency in Japanese, as classes are generally taught in Japanese\*.

To enroll in these programs, international applicants need to go through the same selection process as domestic applicants in principle. The Faculties of Pharmaceutical Sciences and Engineering also have a special selection for privately-financed international applicants. In addition, the Faculties of Law and Economics have a special selection for graduates from schools located in countries other than Japan.

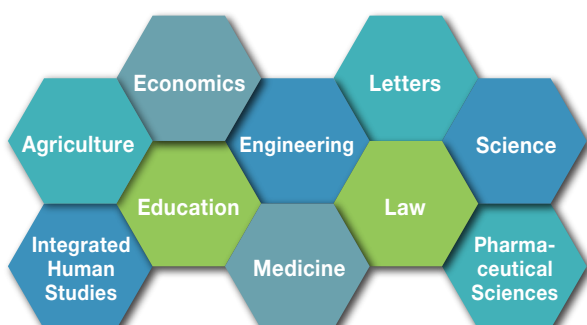

### Graduate Schools

Kyoto University offers a wide range of study areas among 18 graduate schools, of which 10 offer programs which can be completed entirely in English. The academic year begins in April or October. The basic language of education is Japanese\*, though supervision may be offered in English depending on the laboratory/faculty member. Application requirements and procedures vary depending on the graduate school / program.

## Kyoto iUP

Kyoto University International Undergraduate Program



Kyoto iUP is a 4.5-year program comprising a six-month preparatory course followed by four years of undergraduate study. Japanese language proficiency is not required at the outset, as the program provides intensive Japanese language classes. Upon graduation, students are awarded a bachelor's degree in their selected major.

## Non-Degree Programs

### Research Students

Research student is a non-degree seeking status which allows students to conduct research at a graduate school/research institute of their choice.

Many students from abroad enroll as research students to prepare for the graduate program (master's/doctoral/professional degree) under faculty supervision. To qualify for this status, applicants must contact and obtain approval from their prospective supervisor.

### Exchange Students

Kyoto University offers exchange programs accepting students from institutions with a university-level exchange agreement for one semester (6 months) or two semesters (12 months) in Kyoto.

Application guides for both programs are sent out to partner institutions in June and December.

Applications should be submitted to Kyoto University through the home institution's international office; direct applications from students will not be accepted.

### Short-Term International Students

Short-term international students is a status designed to enable international students to study at Kyoto University for a maximum of 3 months. International students enrolled in a non-Japanese university may apply for short-term special courses, such as Amgen Scholars Program, or for a laboratory/supervisor that can host them.

Not all undergraduate faculties/graduate schools/research institutes take short-term international students.

Applicants are therefore advised to contact the relevant faculty for details.

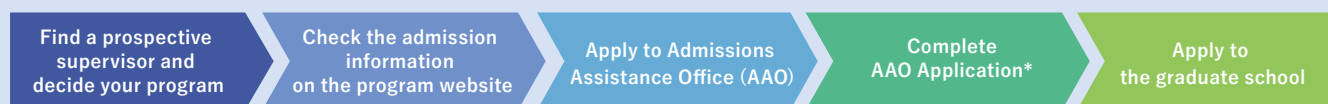

## Scholarships

There are several types of scholarships available for international students, including the Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship. For more information about scholarships, please visit the website below.

### Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship

Kyoto University accepts three categories of MEXT scholarship students: Research Students (graduate degree students and research [non-degree] students), Undergraduate Students, and Japanese Studies Students. There are two ways to apply for the MEXT scholarship. Applications must be submitted before coming to Japan.

- ① Apply through a Japanese diplomatic mission (embassy recommendation)
- ② Apply through a Japanese university (university recommendation)

As the types of scholarships which students are eligible for vary depending on the faculty or graduate school they wish to enroll in, please check the following website and ask the relevant faculty/graduate school office for details.
