
The University's first president, Hiroji Kinoshita, firmly believed in the values of freedom of academic inquiry and student independence. In his remarks at the University's first entrance ceremony he said, "University students should live by the principles of self-reliance and self-respect, and we should expect them to be independent." This spirit of valuing autonomy continues to this day, embodied by the philosophy of Scholarly Freedom.

Today, Kyoto University has 10 faculties, 18 graduate schools, over 30 research and training facilities and hosts more than 60 overseas centers. It has sent over 220,000 graduates into the world, who are active in both academia and business. The University continues to support original and advanced research, producing multiple recipients of global prizes.

Kyoto University

Founded in 1897, Yoshida Campus has been at the core of Kyoto University. Many of its original buildings still remain today, used for teaching and administrative functions. And the University has seen many changes throughout its 125-year history. Did you know that the original camphor tree fell during the 1934 Muroto typhoon? The second generation tree we see today was replanted in 1935. Also, a much different building used to be where the existing clock tower stands. Yoshida campus continues to evolve while retaining the essence of its history.
