### Reasons for Staying at University Beyond Minimum Years to Applicants who are repeating the same grade or remaining at university beyond minimum required years

#### NOTE

"Those who are repeating the same grade" mean students who remain at the same grade from last year. "Those who are remaining at university beyond minimum required years" mean students whose enrolment period run over the minimum required years due to leaving of absence and so on.

In the committee of University, the reasons in each Form 10 will be strictly examined.

#### ○Case examples of students might be considered be intended applicants

Except for when Kyoto University recognizes that such students have done so as the result of completely unavoidable circumstances

Category	Case examples of students are considered be intended applicants
1. Illness/Injury	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Long-term care</li> <li>• Absence a regular exam due to illness</li> </ul>
2. Study abroad	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Study-abroad more than half of a year</li> </ul>
3. Graduate-school doctoral thesis preparation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Obviously take a lot of hard work to finish a doctoral thesis due to the theme is required to handle huge amounts of analysis and collecting data (Except those who applied [Case examples of students are NOT considered be intended applicants-3. Graduate-school doctoral thesis preparation.] )</li> </ul>
4. Other reasons	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Childbirth, childcare and nursing for family</li> <li>• Leaving of absence due to respond to a request from government and participate public projects (e.g. Japan Overseas Cooperation Volunteers, military service, etc.)</li> <li>• Hard part-time work to cover school expenses (<b>except international students</b>)</li> <li>• Inevitable reasons due to COVID-19</li> </ul>

#### ○Case examples of students are NOT considered be intended applicants

Note that you will be considered it unacceptable to apply for Tuition Exemptions according to the yearly committee, if your case falls into the following "Case examples of students are NOT considered be intended applicants"

Category	Case examples of students are NOT considered be intended applicants
1. Illness/Injury	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• illness (including injuries) caused by act in contravention of laws</li> </ul>
2. Study abroad	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Studying abroad for approximately less than half a year</li> <li>• Remaining at university after the semester when you study abroad by overrunning minimum required years</li> <li>• Studying abroad without submission of "Request for Approval of Overseas Travel" form.</li> </ul>
3. Graduate-school doctoral thesis preparation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Remain at university beyond minimum required years for more than a year</li> <li>• Unable to complete a thesis due to the applicants</li> <li>• Thesis preparation except for doctoral thesis</li> </ul>
4. Other reasons	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Taking a national exam (the national board of medical examination, the civil service examination, etc.)</li> <li>• Waiting for employment opportunities</li> <li>• Taking a graduate-school entrance exam</li> <li>• Taking an exam for inter-university or inter-faculty transfer</li> <li>• Lack of prospects to graduate or pass through within maximum years</li> <li>• Voluntary reasons</li> </ul>
